

ATLANTIS SEZ COMMUNITY STAKEHOLDER NETWORK ELECTIONS

VOTING GUIDELINES

1.1. How does voting work?

- Sign in at registration
- Attend the brief information session
- Collect ballot paper
- Cast your vote
- Wait for the votes to be counted after the sector election (optional)

1.2. Who is eligible to vote?

- Only members of stakeholder structures that have registered their intent to participate with GreenCape
- Stakeholder structures that are verified, based on their submitted eligibility criteria
- Organisation representatives who have received a nomination letter
- Nominees who have received communication from GreenCape that they are eligible

1.3. Who counts the votes?

- The counting of votes will be done by GreenCape, directly following each 2 hour sector election

1.4. How is the ballot boxes going to be secured?

- The ballot boxes will be sealed after the votes are counted and verified by the Oversight Committee
- All the ballot boxes will be stored by GreenCape

1.5. How many votes per organisation?

- The member nominated to represent an organisation/stakeholder structure will be allowed one vote per sector

1.6. Can organisation campaign?

- GreenCape is mandated to facilitate and manage the electoral process. Campaigning and lobbying remains the sole responsibility of each stakeholder structure

1.7. What happens to the sectors that have not been allocated a seat on the ASEZ-CSN?

- The ASEZ-CSN will engage with multi-stakeholder forums and their representatives. Through this engagement other sectors and organisations without an allocated seat on the ASEZ-CSN will be able to lend a voice to issues that are relevant to the Atlantis SEZ

1.8. Is multi-sector voting allowed?

- No multi-sector voting will not be allowed. Only one vote per sector
- The sector voting process is a closed process, only eligible nominees will be allowed to vote

1.9. How will the sector nominees be communicated to the Atlantis community?

- The results of the sector elections will be communicated at the AGM on the 7th February 2019
